PURPOSE

To fulfil the requirement for qualified deck crew on Port Taranaki Limited (PTL) company vessels. This position is a progressive role with training to enhance the incumbent's skill base that will allow over time this role to encompass cover for Launch and Tug operations in all roles – Deckhand, Engineer or Master.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

In Harbour Tug and Lunch Manoeuvres

- Act in the capacity of Deck crew as per the minimum manning requirements for all PTL operated vessels.
- Assist in the safe and efficient operation of PTL operated vessels while on duty
- Take responsibility under the Masters supervision for deck operations.
- Assist the master and engineer in day to day maintenance tasks as required.
- Liaise with Marine and other teams to recommend and promote to the Marine Supervisor any activity or improvement, either operationally or of resource, that will enhance the functioning of the small craft operation.
- Liaise with the vessel Engineer/Master in regard to areas of maintenance and operations.

Relief

- Undertake relief work to cover leave within the Operations team where required and qualified to do so.
- This may include but is not limited to:
 - o Deckhand Launch and tug



- Master Workboat, Launch and Tug
- Marine Engineer Launch and Tug
- Marine Operator
- Wharf Services

Out of Port Operations

- Act in any capacity of Deckhand (Master as qualified) during Out of Port contracts. These include:
 - Intervention
 - Towing
 - Survey
 - Salvage
 - Float on/offs
 - FPSO work
 - Voyages
- Assist the Master(s) in the coordination of resources to ensure the Company's vessels(s) are operational and fit for service as required.
- Liaise with the Master and Engineer in regard areas of maintenance and operations.

Health, safety and environment

- Participate in the event reporting process to capture safety issues, security issues, good behaviours and new ideas.
- Maintain open communication with Supervisor/Manager to enable good safety outcomes.
- Stay abreast of safety communications distributed within the company.
- Contribute to the safety performance of the department and wider organisation.
- Actively participate in health, safety and environment (HSE) meetings and initiatives, and adhere to company policies and procedures.
- Actively participate in the event reporting process to capture close calls, safety issues, security issues, good behaviours and new ideas.
- Switch On and take responsibility for the safety of yourself and others around you
